

Scenario 1.

Miko has fond memories of showing friends and families who visit around Japantown and Berkeley. Having lived here all her life, she personally knows shops (and people who work there) and has seen these parts change during her life.

Miko would like to find a way to share tips about travelling to her city, showing people around, and also pass on memories of events in her city.

Miko would also like to be able to explore other cities while travelling there or virtual tours of other cities by listening to other people's stories while she quilts.

Scenario A: Miko is in SF

Miko's daughter, Hannah, tells Miko about an app she found during her trip to London.

Hannah was excited about the fact that she was able to take a tour of 18th century London with a professor of History. The app had an augmented reality portion (?) that let you look through your iPhone camera to see a picture of what the site would have looked at the time of the story. For each site, you can hear stories from other people through time or at that time. Miko downloaded the app for an upcoming weekend trip to DC with Steve.

While browsing the app, Miko looks for a Berkeley tour and finds one. Apart from themed tours already (like the nature tour, civil rights tour, native american tour), she sees that she has the option to make her own tour. While browsing specific sites, she comes across Doe Library, she sees the "Add to the Story(?)" button. That takes her to a screen where she can record audio clips for that location. She can tag the location and time of the story. She can also add pictures from then. She decides to record a story about meeting Steve for the first time at the library and uploads a picture of them when they were young. She shares the audio clip via email with her daughter and via twitter with her followers.

She then looks for a tour of Japantown and finds nothing. She digs through her old photographs and finds old pictures of Japantown from the 60s and decides to make a tour of Japantown in the 60s. She starts with recording audio clips for each location. She can attach pictures that she's already scanned in and added to her photo roll in her phone to each clip and tag a time/date/year when this happened. The app is smart enough to take her images and see if they match current locations. If so, it adds the pictures to its Augmented Reality Image database so people can "See through the Camera" at that location at that time. She can then link those together as a playlist (by looking at her "Tour recorded"). She also adds other stories at different times (not linked to the main Japantown tour) for buildings, events and shops that opened later. She also adds recommendations for souvenir shops and restaurants in the area that she likes. The app automatically links them to yelp reviews. She can then take the trip virtually (which lets her just listen to the tour sequentially) or walk through it. She sends out her tour to her friends who also have memories of Japantown and they add their own tours or clips for each location. Because rankings are anonymous, they can uprank or downrank each others stories. Miko can look at how many people took the tour and read their reviews. Based on it, she can record other

stories or change the tour.
